- Is described in Minnesota Statute 120B.11 School District Process for Reviewing Curriculum, Instruction and Student Achievement; Striving for the World's Best Workforce

- Is a "comprehensive, long-term strategic plan to support and improve teaching and learning"
- Part of the Annual Report for the State
 - Must publish a summary report and share electronically
 - Must hold an annual public meeting
 - Tonight is that annual meeting

 - All children are ready for school.
 - All third-graders can read at grade level.
 - All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
 - All students are ready for career and college.
 - All students graduate from high school.

2016 – 2017 Goals and Results

Goals

- MSA will increase the its current combined level of proficiency in math from 82% to 85% as measured by the MCA test.
- MSA will increase the math proficiency for 8th grade Asian students from 76% to 89% as measured by the MCA test.
- The average ACT score of graduating seniors will meet or exceed a composite score of 28.
- 100% of students who begin their senior year at MSA will meet minimum requirements to graduate on time.

Results

- Goal not meet. MSA's combined proficiency fell from 82% to 79%.
- Goal met. The proficiency for 8th grade Asian students rose from 76% to 92%.
- Goal not met. MSA's graduating seniors had an average composite ACT score of 27.6
- Goal not met. 52 out of 53 MSA students graduated in 2017, or 98%

2016 – 2017 Goals and Results

Goals

- MSA will continue to identify, evaluate, and provide ELL services to students in need
- MSA will keep its combined reading proficiency at 88% or higher.

Results

- Goal met. Using monthly child find meetings, WIDA screener, and access testing, MSA was able to offer continued services to ELL students
- Goal met. MSA's combined reading proficiency for the year was 88%.

2017 - 2018 Goals

Goals

- MSA will increase proficiency rate for 8th grade students from 73% to 82% in math.
- MSA will increase the proficiency rate for Black/African American 8th grade students from 46% to 73% in math.
- The average ACT score of graduating seniors will meet or exceed a composite score of 28.
- 100% of students who begin their senior year at MSA will meet minimum requirements to graduate on time.
 - MSA will provide 30 minutes of additional reading support per week for 8th grade ELL students to support high school readiness



Systems, Strategies, and Support

- Identify students who are struggling by using MCA data
 Provide additional support to individual students
 - including, but not limited to,
 - Check and connect
 - Individualized learning
 - Child find meetings
 - Tier 2 interventions
 - Advisory groups
- All Juniors, and Seniors are individually counseled on academic progress by academic counselor
 Continue to provide PSAT and practice ACT test
- Ms. Ward, 8th grade English teacher has begun "pushing" into other classes to provide support
