In consideration for allowing my child to participate in team events, I hereby forever release MSA and its mentors, advisors, chaperones, or agents from any and all liability for any damage or injuries suffered by my child or his/her property while engaging in events and agree to hold them harmless there from. During team events, including transportation to/from the events, students will be required to follow all rules, expectations, and guidelines of MSA and its Code of Conduct. In consideration of the above statements, I give permission for my child listed above to attend these events.
I understand the necessary arrangements; plans and precautions will be taken for my child for care and supervision of my child during the trip.
I will be responsible for paying all expenses related to sending the student home from the trip for disciplinary reasons or illness based upon the lead mentor's assessment.
In case of an accident or serious illness, I request the coach to contact me. If unable to reach me, the coach may make whatever arrangements that are deemed necessary.
Overnight competitions and meets are team events which require collaboration and
cooperation between students, mentors, parents, and the Math & Science Academy
advisor/staff. All Math & Science Academy school policies (Student Conduct Behavior Code and
Faculty Handbook) are to be enforced on said trips, and participants (students, mentors,
parents, and MSA staff) will be held to the rules and regulations outlined in each. Students, parents, and mentors are expected to exhibit MSA core values. This is
expected not only while competing, but also in the stands, in the hotel, and in the community.
Respect, kindness, cooperation, and encouragement is expected not only within the team, but
with all interactions. Language should be respectful and everyone is expected to refrain from
non-professional language (such as swearing). As a reminder, teams are often chosen for
team-collaborative play based on behaviors on and off the competition field, and conversations
are easily overheard.
All travel arrangements are made by the individual students and parents. MSA staff will not be arranging transportation. A parent mentor may communicate a suggested team hotel or arrange for discounted rates, but booking is the responsibility of each individual parent.
Students are not required to stay at the same hotel as the majority of the team, but all students
should attend team functions.
All meals are the responsibility of the student. While some hotels offer breakfast, some
may not. Specific information about competition site meal options can usually be found on the
website associated with a particular meet.
Students will stay in hotel rooms with their parents. Exceptions to this rule may be
granted with the permission of parents providing the room (in the case of housing an additional
student), parents sending a student unaccompanied, and the MSA coach/advisor. As per the
travel waiver, MSA will not be held liable for students during the trip.
Students staying with their parents will abide by all the same team rules and regulations set forth by the MSA advisor and lead mentors (curfew, team meetings, etc.)
set forth by the MSA advisor and lead mentors (curfew, team meetings, etc). If a room curfew is necessary, the MSA coach/advisor/lead mentor will communicate the
time during team meetings. The time is subject to change, based on the circumstances. When
implemented, room curfews are to be observed by all students, even when students are staying
with parents.

During competition hours, students may not leave the premises of the conference
center unless they are accompanied by another team member or an adult. Students may not
leave the center without permission from a lead mentor. When requesting an absence, students
must provide the mentor with specifics as to the necessity of their absence, destination, and
return time. The mentors should know the whereabouts of each student at all times during the
competition; students have a responsibility to be sure that the mentors know where they are
during competition.
In the case of an extended lunch-break, students must never leave the building alone.
Students may leave with parents or other students if restaurants/hotels are within walking
distance, but plans should be communicated with mentors. Again, mentors should know the
general whereabouts of each student at all times during extended breaks; students have a
responsibility to be sure that the mentors know where they are during breaks.
During non-competition hours, students are the responsibility of their parents; students have a responsibility to be sure that their parents know where they are during non-competition
hours.
Students are responsible for their own property, including phones, jackets, headphones,
etc. It is advised that unessential valuables be left at home.
If a student is unable to be accompanied by a parent but wishes to attend the
competition, the student must notify the lead mentors as early as possible to attempt to arrange
a parent willing to sponsor them (thereby effectively assuming responsibility for the student).
Students are responsible to pay their portion of lodging with a family.
If a financial burden prevents a student from attending, either a student or parent may
contact the MSA Staff coach/advisor/lead mentor to determine if arrangements may be made or
to see if scholarships are available.
As per MSHSL rules, students must meet all eligibility rules to participate in competition.
Any behavior that takes place that violates school policy must be communicated to
school administration immediately following the event.
